Welcome to the 2025 Seven-State Biennial Exhibition! This is our 12th Seven-State competition, and we're honored to have renowned ceramist Von Venhuizen as this year's juror. As has been the case in the last eleven Biennial Exhibitions, the artwork is astounding.

This year's competition was as fierce as it has ever been, with 44 pieces created by 33 artists being chosen for the exhibition. This show contains many forms of painting, countless ways of utilizing mixed media, painstaking works of pottery, fused glass, steampunk sculpture, incredible collage constructions, and so much more. A visitor must walk through the gallery several times to even begin to realize the depth of what is on display in this Exhibition.

If you have seen this year's poster for the Exhibition, you may have noticed that all 12 jurors, beginning with our first Seven-State Biennial in 2001, have been highlighted. 
